PLC Mission

PLCs: Professional-learning communities will meet regularly in a collaborative effort to look at assessment, curriculum, and data. PLCs will also view students' academic progress and progress monitoring tools to enhance student learning. Barriers of learning will also be identified so strategies can be developed to mitigate such barriers. Each PLC will have a leader and the PLC will be a collaborative group made up of representation of teachers, paraprofessionals, administrators of all district schools in program areas such as literacy, math, and art.

PLC Meeting Protocols

Each meeting is to be guided by the following components:

Shared Leaderships
Shared Governance
Visionary
Collaboration
Guiding Questions:

- 1. What do students need to learn?
- 2. How do we know they learned it?
- 3. If they have not learned it, what are we doing about it?

Applications of the PLC meeting should include discussions about:

Systemic Assessments
Data Collection and assessment
Progress Monitoring
Bridging gaps of learning
Monitoring of vertical learning and horizontal learning
Monitoring student outcomes
